Task 1 – Evidence Document

Create a new word-processed document.

Task 2 – Web Page

You are going to create a web page for the Alinao Beach and Dive Resort in the Philippines. The web page must work in any browser. All colour codes must be in hexadecimal.

1 Create a new folder called **AB**

Locate the following files and store them in your *AB* folder.

 2032-ab2.htm
 2032-accom.jpg
 2032-alinao.mp4
 2032-beach.jpg
 2032-logo.jpg
 2032-view.jpg

Open the file **2032-accom.jpg**

Crop this image to remove the top so that the image is 456 pixels high and 265 pixels wide.

Save this image as **2032-acc.jpg**

Display the contents of your *AB* folder showing the folder name, all file names, extensions, image dimensions and file sizes. [3]

EVIDENCE 1

Take a screenshot of your *AB* folder and place this in your Evidence Document. Make sure that the folder name, all file names, extensions, image dimensions and file sizes are clearly visible.

2 Create a web page called **ab.htm**

This web page must work in all browsers and will have a table structure as shown below:

Each table cell is identified with a letter and all dimensions are in pixels. The letters and dimensions shown in the table must **not** appear on your final web page. The table shows the spacing between cells which will be set when your stylesheet is attached in step 9.

Table borders must appear on the final web page.

3 Place in cell A the image **2032-logo.jpg**

4 Place in cell B, a placeholder, 855 pixels wide and 480 pixels high, containing the video clip **2032-alinao.mp4** Display an automated text-based error message if the browser does not support this video type.

5 Place in cell:

- C the text **Location**
- D the text **Accommodation**
- E the text **Beach**

Set this text to style h2.

- 6 Place in cell:
- F the image **2032-view.jpg**
 - G the image **2032-acc.jpg**
 - H the image **2032-beach.jpg**

Where necessary, in the HTML, make sure that each image is displayed as 265 pixels wide whilst maintaining the aspect ratio.

- 7 Enter in cell I the text:

Web page last updated by followed by a space, then your name, centre number and candidate number.

Set this text to style h3.

- 8 Add appropriate alternate text to all still images.

- 9 Attach the stylesheet **2032-ab.css** to this web page.

Save your web page.

- 10 Set the name of the default target window to **_blank**

- 11 Create hyperlinks from the text *Location* and from the image *2032-view.jpg* to open the web page **2032-ab2.htm** in a new browser window called **_location**

- 12 Create a hyperlink from all the text placed in cell I to send an email message to ab@cambridgeinternational.org with a subject line **Enquiry about Alinao**

Display the web page in your browser. If necessary, resize it so that:

- all the page width can be seen
- all text can be easily read
- the address bar is visible.

Task 3 – Data Analysis

You are going to edit a spreadsheet to calculate profit and loss for the Alinao Beach and Dive Resort. Alinao's financial year is split into four quarters. Each quarter has three months. All currency values must be in dollars to 0 decimal places.

- 13 Open and examine the file **2032-summary.csv** in a spreadsheet package.

In the header enter and centre align the text:

Edited by: followed by a space, your name, centre number and candidate number.

In the footer enter and centre align the text:

Edited on: followed by a space, today's automated date, a space then the text **at** followed by a space then the automated time.

Save this as a spreadsheet with the file name **Summary_** followed by your centre number and candidate number. For example, Summary_ZZ999_9999

Format the merged cell in row 1 to contain orange text, font size 24, on a black background. The text in this cell should contrast with the background when printed in black and white.

Format the text in the merged cells in column B to be font size 20.

- 15 In cell D12 use a function to calculate the total number of visitors for April, May and June. [1]
- 16 In cell E12 use a function to calculate the total income for April, May and June. [1]
- 17 In cell F12 use a function to calculate the total expenditure for April, May and June. [1]
- 18 Replicate the formulae entered in steps 15 to 17 to calculate the sub-totals for all other quarters. [1]
- 19 Calculate the profit for each month and each quarter.
- Profit = Income – Expenditure* [2]
- 20 Calculate, in appropriate cells, the total number of visitors, the total income, the total expenditure and the total profit for the year. [1]
- 21 Format cell G9 to have a red background with white text, only if the value in the cell is negative.
- Apply this formatting to cells B3 to B6 and to all other cells containing numeric values in column G. [4]

EVIDENCE 4

Place in your Evidence Document a screenshot that shows how you applied the formatting to cell G9.

- 22 In cell B3 use a function to display the highest profit for any quarter. [2]
- 23 In cell B4 use a function to display the lowest profit for any quarter. [1]
- 24 In cell B5 use a function to display the average monthly profit. [2]
- 25 In cell B6 use a function to display the average quarterly profit. [1]
- 26 Format all currency values in dollars with 0 decimal places. [1]
- 27 In cell C3 use a formula to display the number of the quarter which made the highest quarterly profit. The number of each quarter is displayed in column B. [2]

28 Save your spreadsheet

Print your spreadsheet showing the formulae. Make sure:

- it is in landscape orientation
- the row and column headings are displayed
- the contents of all cells are fully visible and can be easily read.
